



Senior Summer Reading Assignment English IV



2. Entry number two should answer the question: Is Hyde purely evil? Again, the response should include specific references from the novel to support your position.
 - **Due Wed., July 27th by 11:59 p.m.**
3. Entry number three should answer the question: Is either aware of or bothered by the other? Make sure to reference specific support.
 - **Due Wed., August 10th by 11:59 p.m.**

Assignment #3:

Select **one** of the essay prompts below and develop an essay meeting the following requirements:

- ✓ Strong claim that addresses the prompt
- ✓ Three pieces of relevant evidence from the book, including context for each piece of evidence
- ✓ Adequate analysis of evidence that explains the evidence and connects it back to the claim
- ✓ Evidence cited following APA format (author, year of publication, page number) after each piece of evidence
- ✓ 750-1000 words, typed and double space
- ✓ Times New Romans, 12-point font
- ✓ Title and Reference page
- ✓ Uploaded to Google Classroom
- ✓ **Due Wed., August 24th by 11:59 p.m.**

Essay prompts:

Option #1- Discuss this novel as a "mystery story" and demonstrate how there are many clues that lead the reader to solve the "mystery" before the solution is revealed to us in the final Chapters.

Option #2- Using this novel as your basis, discuss the nature of "good" and "evil" and the duality of man's nature, as presented in this novel.
